



TxMOUD Funding Information for MAT/OTS Programs

Funding is provided for treatment services and medications (buprenorphine, extended-release naltrexone, and methadone) to treat opioid use disorder. Funds are ONLY for individuals who meet <u>HHSC financial criteria</u> and cannot afford treatment otherwise. This does not prohibit your program for colocation with commercial and private pay treatment reimbursement.

Where does the funding come from?

Funding for the Texas Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (TxMOUD) initiative is funded (in part) by The Health and Human Services Commission from State Opioid Response (SOR) and State Targeted Response (STR) Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services (SAMHSA) grants. What does the funding cover?

- Medication for opioid use disorder (buprenorphine, extended-release naltrexone, and methadone)
- Cost of physician services
- Testing and treatment of communicable diseases for patients receiving MOUD
- Counseling and other relevant appointments/services as specified in the chart below

How does the reimbursement work?

- TxMOUD MAT Contractors complete the required patient intake assessment and documentation in CMBHS
- If the patient is financially eligible and is in need of medication for opioid use disorder, the MAT Contractor can submit a Service Authorization Request in CMBHS
- TxMOUD then approves the Service Authorization Request within 1 business day
- The MAT Contractor's provider can then write a prescription or provide the medication for the patient that will be funded by TxMOUD
 - Based on how your site operates, you can:
 - 1) store medications on site, and/or
 - 2) work with local pharmacies to provide medications
 - *We can provide assistance with pharmacy contracting/MOUs
- Sites/providers submit billable services in CMBHS and submit invoices to TxMOUD at UT Health San Antonio via email.
- Once the invoice is received, the provided services will be checked with what has been entered and approved for reimbursement in CMBHS.
- Reimbursement will be provided via direct deposit from UT Health San Antonio once the invoice has been processed.
